## CONTEST OVERVIEW

For the first time ever, the Native Languages Center is hosting a photo contest for students attending Tribal Colleges. The top submissions will be published on the new Native Languages Center website and featured in other media outlets with credit to the photographer/artist. Students are encouraged to be thoughtful about their submission and present their best work, as publication provides students with exposure and is great material to use on resumes. The contest is centered around the prompt:

**What does your language mean to you?**

## PRIZE

The top submissions will be featured and published on the Native Languages website and other media outlets with their full name and TCU attribution. Eight winners will each receive a \$50 gift card.

By submitting your artwork, you acknowledge AIHEC Native Languages Center's right to use all customary means to publish and distribute the work, including but not limited to the Native Languages website, various online services, social networking sites, e-books, and mobile digital applications.

## CONTEST RULES

- ✓ All participants must be registered and enrolled at an AIHEC-affiliated Tribal College.
- ✓ Students must provide their full name and field of study.
- ✓ Only one high-resolution image should be submitted per student.
- ✓ Each photograph should relate to the prompt and convey its message.
- ✓ A brief description answering the prompt must be submitted with your photograph. No more than 250 words.
- ✓ All submissions should be emailed to [mjohnson@aihec.org](mailto:mjohnson@aihec.org) from an AIHEC-accredited Tribal College student email.
- ✓ Only one entry per person is allowed.
- ✓ The deadline cannot be extended, and any entries received after the deadline will not be considered.
- ✓ Any entry that does not follow the above criteria will be disqualified.
- ✓ Top submissions and winners will be notified via email.

All students attending a Tribal College or University are encouraged to participate.
